This book follows a young boy on a train ride to the North Pole, while he learns about the true meaning of Christmas.


5th-6th Grade: Elf by: Art Ruiz

Volunteer to read stories to youth or elderly


THE SCIENCE OF SNOWFLAKES


Did you know that every snowflake is unique from any other snowflake? Just like how we are all so unique and special!


