1st-4th Grade: Charlotte' Web By: E.B. White


Imagine a world where kids can talk to animals! Charlotte's Web is a book that all St. Mary's students read during elementary school! They love getting into chapter books!


7th Grade: The Outsiders by: S.E. Hinton




**8th Grade**: The Giver by: Lois Lowry


